### AGREED ORDER

On this the 27 day of Ganuary, 2015, came to be considered by the Texas Board of Veterinary Medical Examiners (Board) the matter of the license of CASSIE EPSTEIN, D.V.M. (Respondent). Pursuant to Section 801.408, Texas Occupations Code, and Board Rule 575.29, an informal conference was held on November 18, 2014. Respondent attended the informal conference and was represented by counsel, Caleena D. Svatek. The Board was represented at the conference by the Board's Enforcement Committee.


Respondent, without admitting the truth of the findings and conclusions set out in this Agreed Order, wishes to waive a formal adjudicative hearing and thereby informally dispose of the issues without a formal adjudication. Respondent agrees to comply with the terms and conditions set forth in this Order. In waiving an adjudicative hearing, Respondent acknowledges her understanding of the alleged violations and the adequacy and sufficiency of the notice provided to her.

Upon the recommendation of the Enforcement Committee and with Respondent's consent, the Board makes the following Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law and enters this Agreed Order as set forth below.

# Findings of Fact

- I. Respondent, CASSIE EPSTEIN, D.V.M. of Denton, Texas, holds Texas veterinary license 10689.
- 2. The Board has jurisdiction over the subject matter and Respondent. Respondent received notice, which may be required by law and by the rules of the Board. All jurisdictional requirements have been satisfied under Tex. Occ. Code Ann. Title 4 (Act). By entering into this Agreed Order, Respondent waives any defect in the notice and any further right to notice and hearing under the Act; Tex. Gov't Code Ann. §§ 2001.051-.054; and the Rules of the Texas Board of Veterinary Medical Examiners (Board Rules) (22 Tex. Admin. Code, Chapter 575).
- 3. Respondent is the owner of the Animal Hospital on Teasley Lane ("Hospital") in Denton, Texas.

- 4. On January 29, 2014, a Board investigator conducted a compliance inspection of Respondent at the Hospital. During the inspection, the investigator noted that Respondent failed to maintain any balances for her 20 controlled substances.
- 5. Respondent stated during the inspection that she supplied the City of Denton Animal Shelter with Ketamine to sedate animals prior to euthanasia but that she failed to establish a veterinary-client-patient relationship prior to dispensing the Ketamine. A peace officer with the City of Denton provided Respondent with a copy of his DEA license and represented to Respondent that this practice was allowed.
- 6. After the investigation of this case was initiated by the Board, in February of 2014, Respondent completed 4.5 hours of continuing education regarding controlled substances.

## Conclusions of Law

- 1. Respondent is required to comply with the provisions of the Veterinary Licensing Act, Chapter 801, Texas Occupations Code, and with the Board's Rules.
- 2. Based on the above Findings of Fact, Respondent violated Section 801.351 of the Veterinary Licensing Act, Texas Occupations Code, by failing to establish a veterinarian-client-patient relationship by examining the animal in order to attain sufficient knowledge of the animal to initiate at least a general or preliminary diagnosis of the animal's medical condition.
- 3. Based on the above Findings of Fact, Respondent violated section 801.402 (13) of the Veterinary Licensing Act, by ordering a prescription drug for the treatment of an animal without first establishing a veterinarian-client-patient relationship.
- 4. Based on the above Findings of Fact, Respondent has violated Rule 573.41, USE OF PRESCRIPTION DRUGS, of the Board's Rules of Professional Conduct, by failing to establish a veterinarian-client-patient relationship prior to prescribing, dispensing, delivering, or ordering delivered prescription drugs.
- 5. Based on the above Findings of Fact, Respondent has violated Rule 573.50, CONTROLLED SUBSTANCES RECORDS KEEPING FOR DRUGS ON HAND, of the Board's Rules of Professional Conduct, by failing to record the accurate balance on hand for each controlled substance.
- 6. Based on the above Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, Respondent has violated Sections 801,402 (4) and (6) of the Veterinary Licensing Act, Texas Occupations Code, and is subject to disciplinary action by the Board:

801.402. GENERAL GROUNDS FOR LICENSE DENIAL OR DISCIPLINARY ACTION. A person is subject to denial of a license or to disciplinary action under Section 801.401 if the person:...

- (4) engages in...illegal practices in, or connected with, the practice of veterinary medicine...
- (6) engages in practices or conduct that violates the board's rules of professional conduct...
- 7. Based on Conclusions of Law 1 through 5, Respondent is subject to disciplinary action under Section 801.401 of the Veterinary Licensing Act, Texas Occupations Code:

801.401. DISCIPLINARY POWERS OF BOARD. (a) If an applicant or license holder is subject to denial of a license or to disciplinary action under Section 801.402, the Board may: (a)

- (1) refuse to examine an applicant or to issue or renew a license;
- (2) revoke or suspend a license;
- (3) place on probation a license holder or person whose license has been suspended;
- (4) reprimand a license holder; or
- (5) impose an administrative penalty.
- ... (d) In addition to other disciplinary actions authorized by this subchapter, the board may require a license holder who violates this chapter to participate in a continuing education program.
- 8. Based on Conclusions of Law 1 through 6, Respondent may be disciplined in the manner set out in Section 801.451, IMPOSITION OF ADMINISTRATIVE PENALTY, of the Veterinary Licensing Act, which authorizes an administrative penalty for violations of the Act and Board rules.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE BOARD AND RESPONDENT AGREE AS FOLLOWS:

Based on the above Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, the Board orders that Respondent receive a FORMAL REPRIMAND.

The Board ORDERS that Respondent pay, within 45 days of the date the Board approves this Order, an ADMINISTRATIVE PENALTY of FIVE HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$500.00). If Respondent fails to pay the administrative penalty within 45 days of the date the Board approves

this Agreed Order, Respondent's license may be suspended until the penalty is paid.

The Board further ORDERS that Respondent shall take and pass the Texas veterinary jurisprudence examination within 90 days from the date of this Agreed Order.

#### The Board further ORDERS that:

- 1. Respondent shall abide by the Rules of Professional Conduct, the Texas Veterinary Licensing Act, and the laws of the State of Texas and the United States.
- 2. Respondent shall cooperate with the Board's attorneys, investigators, compliance officers and other employees and agents investigating Respondent's compliance with this Agreed Order.
- 3. Failure by Respondent to comply with the terms of this Agreed Order or with any other provisions of the Licensing Act or the Board Rules, may result in further disciplinary action.

Respondent, by signing this Agreed Order, acknowledges her understanding of the Agreed Order, the notice, and Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law set forth herein, and agrees that she will satisfactorily comply with the mandates of the Agreed Order in a timely manner or be subject to appropriate disciplinary action by the Board.

Respondent, by signing this Agreed Order, waives her right to a formal hearing and any right to seck judicial review of this Agreed Order. Respondent acknowledges that she had the right to be represented by legal counsel in this matter.

RESPONDENT WAIVES ANY FURTHER HEARINGS OR APPEALS TO THE BOARD OR TO ANY COURT IN REGARD TO ALL TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF THIS AGREED ORDER. RESPONDENT AGREES THAT THIS IS A FINAL ORDER.

The effective date of this Agreed Order shall be the date it is adopted by the Board.

I. CASSIE EPSTEIN, D.V.M., HAVE READ AND UNDERSTAND THE FOREGOING AGREED ORDER. I UNDERSTAND BY SIGNING IT, I WAIVE CERTAIN RIGHTS. I SIGN IT VOLUNTARILY. I UNDERSTAND THAT THIS ORDER CONTAINS THE ENTIRE AGREEMENT AND THERE IS NO OTHER AGREEMENT OF ANY KIND, VERBAL, WRITTEN OR OTHERWISE.


