AGREED ORDER

On this the 9th day of June, 2005 came on to be considered by the Texas State Board of Veterinary Medical Examiners ("Board") the matter of the license of DARR F. WILSON, D.V. M ("Respondent"). Pursuant to Section 801.408, Texas Occupations Code and Board Rule 575.27, an informal conference was held on March 31, 2005. The Respondent attended the conference without counsel. The Board was represented at the conference by the Board's Enforcement Committee.

Respondent, without admitting the truth of the findings and conclusions set out in this Agreed Order, wishes to waive a formal adjudicative hearing and thereby informally dispose of the issues without a formal adjudication. Respondent agrees to comply with the terms and conditions set forth in this Order. In waiving an adjudicative hearing, Respondent acknowledges his understanding of the alleged violations and the adequacy and sufficiency of the notice provided to him.

Upon the recommendation of the Enforcement Committee and with Respondent's consent, the Board makes the following Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law and enters this Agreed Order as set forth below.

Findings of Fact

1. On July 13, 2004, Rianne Bernard, League City, Texas, presented her cat "Murphy" to Darr F. Wilson, D.V.M., Webster, Texas, because the cat had been urinating outside of his litter box. Dr. Wilson found that the cat had a urinary obstruction. Dr. Wilson treated the cat to eliminate the obstruction and released the cat the next day with a prescription for Amoxi-drops and methionine.
2. About a week after "Murphy's" release, the cat exhibited pain. Dr. Wilson examined the cat on July 19th. Dr. Wilson sedated the cat and flushed the cat's urinary system. Dr. Wilson released the cat on the same day. Upon arrival at home, the cat was lethargic and had blood under his tail and on the surrounding fur. The next morning, Ms. Bernard found him in the bathtub, apparently dying. Ms. Bernard called Dr. Wilson, who informed her that "Murphy" was probably full of toxins and in pain. Ms. Bernard returned the cat to Dr. Wilson who performed euthanasia.
3. Dr. Wilson's patient records for "Murphy" are deficient. Dr. Wilson said that he offered Ms. Bernard treatment options which were declined, but there is no documentation in the records. No temperature is noted for the July 13th visit. No temperature or weight is indicated for the July 19th

visit. The record does not indicate if surgery was discussed. Details of the examination, diagnosis, treatment options, and routes of administration of anesthesia were lacking in the record and not remembered by Dr. Wilson.

Conclusions of Law

1. Respondent is required to comply with the provisions of the Veterinary Licensing Act, Chapter 801, Texas Occupations Code, and with the Board's Rules.
2. Based on Finding of Fact 3, Respondent has violated Rule 573.52, PATIENT RECORD KEEPING, of the Board's Rules of Professional Conduct, which requires that a patient's record include details necessary to substantiate the examination, diagnosis, and treatment provided.
3. Based on Finding of Fact 3 and Conclusions of Law 1 and 2, Respondent has violated Section 801.402 (6) of the Veterinary Licensing Act, Texas Occupations Code, and is subject to disciplinary action by the Board:
 - 801.402. GENERAL GROUNDS FOR LICENSE DENIAL OR DISCIPLINARY ACTION. A person is subject to denial of a license or to disciplinary action under Section 801.401 if the person:
 - (6) engages in practices or conduct that violates the board's rules of professional conduct.
4. Based on Conclusions of Law 1 through 3, Respondent is subject to disciplinary action under Section 801.401 of the Veterinary Licensing Act, Texas Occupations Code:
 - 801.401. DISCIPLINARY POWERS OF BOARD. (a) If an applicant or license holder is subject to denial of a license or to disciplinary action under Section 801.402, the Board may:
 - (1) refuse to examine an applicant or to issue or renew a license;
 - (2) revoke or suspend a license;
 - (3) place on probation a license holder or person whose license has been suspended;
 - (4) reprimand a license holder; or
 - (5) impose a civil penalty.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE BOARD AND RESPONDENT AGREE AS FOLLOWS:

Based on the above Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, the Board **ORDERS** that Darr F. Wilson, D.V.M., be **INFORMALLY REPRIMANDED**.

The Board further ORDERS that:

1 Respondent shall abide by the Rules of Professional Conduct, the Texas Veterinary Licensing Act, and the laws of the State of Texas and the United States.

2. Respondent shall cooperate with the Board's attorneys, investigators, compliance officers and other employees and agents investigating Respondent's compliance with this Order.

3. Failure by Respondent to comply with the terms of this Agreed Order or with any other provisions of the Licensing Act or the Board Rules, may result in further disciplinary action.

Respondent, by signing this Agreed Order, acknowledges his understanding of the Agreed Order, the notice, and Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law herein set forth herein, and agrees that he will satisfactorily comply with the mandates of the Agreed Order in a timely manner or be subject to appropriate disciplinary action by the Board.

Respondent, by signing this Agreed Order, waives his right to a formal hearing and any right to seek judicial review of this Agreed Order. Respondent acknowledges that he is not represented by legal counsel in this matter.

RESPONDENT WAIVES ANY FURTHER HEARINGS OR APPEALS TO THE BOARD OR TO ANY COURT IN REGARD TO ALL TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF THIS AGREED ORDER. NOTHING IN THIS ORDER SHALL BE DEEMED A WAIVER OF RESPONDENT'S RIGHTS UNDER STATUTE OR UNDER THE UNITED STATES OR TEXAS CONSTITUTIONS TO APPEAL AN ORDER OR ACTION OF THE BOARD SUBSEQUENT TO THIS AGREED ORDER EXCEPT AS RESPONDENT MAY HAVE OTHERWISE AGREED TO HEREIN. RESPONDENT AGREES THAT THIS IS A FINAL ORDER.

The effective date of this Agreed Order shall be the date it is adopted by the Board.

I, **DARR F. WILSON**, D.V.M., HAVE READ AND UNDERSTAND THE FOREGOING AGREED ORDER. I UNDERSTAND BY SIGNING IT, I WAIVE CERTAIN RIGHTS. I SIGN IT VOLUNTARILY. I UNDERSTAND THAT THIS ORDER CONTAINS THE ENTIRE AGREEMENT AND THERE IS NO OTHER AGREEMENT OF ANY KIND, VERBAL, WRITTEN OR OTHERWISE.

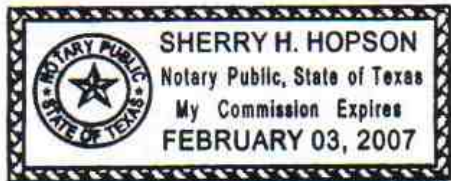
