AGREED ORDER

On this day the Texas Board of Veterinary Medical Examiners (“Board”) considered the matter of the license of Jason Schroeder, D.V.M. (“Respondent”).

Respondent, without admitting the truth of the Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law set out in this Order, waived notice and hearing and agreed to the entry of this Order. Accordingly, the Board makes the following Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law and enters this Order as set forth below.

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. Respondent, Jason Schroeder, D.V.M., of Littlefield, Texas, holds Texas veterinary license 7576.
2. On November 21, 2017, Stacy Nichols presented her ten-year old Labrador Retriever, Lucy, to Respondent at Shallowater Animal Clinic in Shallowater, Texas. Ms. Nichols reported that Lucy had arthritis, vision problems, and inappropriate urination. On December 4, 2017, Respondent performed bloodwork. Respondent prescribed medications for arthritis and urine leakage. Ms. Nichols also reported a mild cough that had lasted several months. Respondent performed chest radiographs and prescribed Vetmedin and Furosemide. Respondent’s radiographs did not indicate whether it was left or right or whether it was ventral-dorsal or dorsal-ventral positioning. Respondent stated that he offered Ms. Nichols a referral to a cardiologist, but Ms. Nichols declined. Respondent’s medical records do not include this offer to refer.
3. On December 26, 2017, Lucy was presented to Respondent for vomiting and decreased appetite. Lucy was hospitalized until January 1, 2018. Respondent’s medical records do not indicate whether Furosemide and Vetmedin were continued during hospitalization. Respondent’s medical records do not include notations of urination and defecation.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. Pursuant to Texas Occupations Code, Chapter 801, the Board has jurisdiction over this matter. Respondent is required to comply with the provisions of the Veterinary License Act, Chapter 801, Texas Occupations Code, and with the Board's Rules. Respondent received notice as required by law.
2. Respondent has violated Board Rule 573.52, Veterinarian Patient Record Keeping, of the Board's Rules of Professional Conduct.
3. Respondent has violated Section 801.402(6) of the Veterinary Licensing Act, Texas Occupations Code, prohibiting licensed veterinarians from engaging in practices or conduct that violates the board's rules of professional conduct.
4. Respondent is subject to disciplinary action under Texas Occupations Code, Sections 801.401(a), and 801.451.
5. Pursuant to Board Rule 575.25, Respondent's violations are Class C violations, and Respondent is subject to disciplinary action under that Rule.

TERMS OF ORDER

Now, therefore, the Board and Respondent agree to the following terms:

1. REPRIMAND
 - a. Respondent is hereby informally reprimanded by the Board. This informal reprimand will be published in the Board's newsletter and will not be routinely reported to the American Association of Veterinary State Boards (AAVSB) for inclusion in the national reporting database. A copy of this informal reprimand will be forwarded to the AAVSB if specifically requested by that organization.
2. ADMINISTRATIVE PENALTY
 - a. Respondent shall pay an administrative penalty of five hundred dollars (\$500.00) within 30 days of the date the Board approved this Order. Payment shall be made directly to the Texas Board of Veterinary Medical Examiners at 333 Guadalupe Street, Suite 3-810, Austin, Texas 78701. Partial payments will not be accepted.
 - b. If Respondent does not timely pay the administrative penalty, the Board may deny a request to renew Respondent's license until the outstanding administrative penalty is received, pursuant to Board Rule 573.62(b). Any monetary funds paid to the Board to renew a license shall first be applied to any outstanding unpaid administrative penalties, pursuant to Board Rule 571.57. Additionally, the matter may be referred to the Attorney General for collection, pursuant to Texas Occupations Code, Section 801.458.

3. CONTINUING EDUCATION

- a. In addition to the annual continuing education required for license renewal, Respondent shall complete three (3) hours of continuing education in the area of patient recordkeeping within six months of the date the Board approves this Order. Respondent shall submit documentation of the completed continuing education penalty and the required annual continuing education to the Board prior to Respondent's next deadline to renew his license. Documentation shall be submitted directly to the Texas Board of Veterinary Medical Examiners at 333 Guadalupe Street, Suite 3-810, Austin, Texas 78701.

4. ADHERENCE TO THE LAW AND BOARD RULES

- a. Respondent shall abide by the Board's Rules of Professional Conduct, the Texas Veterinary Licensing Act, and the laws of the State of Texas and the United States.
- b. Respondent shall cooperate with the Board's attorneys, investigators, compliance officers and other employees and agents investigating Respondent's compliance with this Order.
- c. Failure by Respondent to comply with the terms of this Order, or with any other provisions of the Veterinary Licensing Act or the Board Rules, may result in further disciplinary action.

The effective date of the terms of this Order shall be the date it is adopted by the Board, unless stated otherwise.



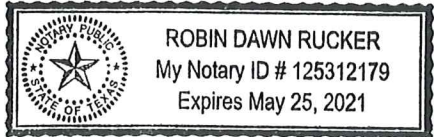
