IN THE MATTER OF § TEXAS BOARD OF
THE LICENSE OF § VETERINARY
LINWOOD STARKS, D.V.M. § MEDICAL EXAMINERS

AGREED ORDER

On this day the Texas Board of Veterinary Medical Examiners (“Board”) considered the matter of the license of Linwood Starks, D.V.M. (“Respondent”).

Respondent, without admitting the truth of the Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law set out in this Order, waived notice and hearing and agreed to the entry of this Order. Accordingly, the Board makes the following Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law and enters this Order as set forth below.

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. Respondent, Linwood Starks, D.V.M., of Grand Prairie, Texas, holds Texas veterinary license #11780.
2. On January 11, 2020, the owner of canine, Whiskey, took Whiskey to Dr. Starks to be neutered. The owner picked Whiskey up later that same day.
3. The owner took Whiskey out unleashed to use the bathroom and later noticed he was bleeding from his incision site.
4. That evening, the owner took Whiskey to an Emergency Vet Clinic. The emergency veterinarian determined that Whiskey’s incision had re-opened and he had developed a hematoma. The emergency veterinarian did not repair the sutures, and instead unsuccessfully attempted to apply skin glue. The owner and Whiskey were sent home with antibiotics and instructions to watch the incision.
5. On January 13, 2020, two days after Dr. Starks’ surgery, the owner took Whiskey to his regular veterinarian where he underwent an exploratory procedure for scrotal ablation, blood clot removal, and wound closure.
6. Respondent’s medical records also did not contain specific details of the procedure performed.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. Pursuant to Texas Occupations Code, Chapter 801, the Board has jurisdiction over this matter. Respondent is required to comply with the provisions of the Veterinary Licensing Act, Chapter 801, Texas Occupations Code, and with the Board's Rules. Respondent received notice as required by law.
2. Respondent has violated Board Rule 573.22, Professional Standard of Care, Board Rule 573.52, Veterinarian Patient Record Keeping, of the Board's Rules of Professional Conduct.
3. Respondent has violated Section 801.402(6) of the Veterinary Licensing Act, Texas Occupations Code, prohibiting engaging in practices or conduct that violates the board's rules of professional conduct.
4. Respondent is subject to disciplinary action under Texas Occupations Code, Sections 801.401(a), and 801.451.
5. Pursuant to Board Rule 575.25, Respondent's violations are Class B violations, and Respondent is subject to disciplinary action under that Rule.

TERMS OF ORDER

Now, therefore, the Board and Respondent agree to the following terms:

1. REPRIMAND
 - a. Respondent is hereby informally reprimanded by the Board. This informal reprimand will not be published in the Board's newsletter and will not be routinely reported to the American Association of Veterinary State Boards (AAVSB) for inclusion in the national reporting database. A copy of this informal reprimand will be forwarded to the AAVSB if specifically requested by that organization.
2. CONTINUING EDUCATION
 - a. In addition to the annual continuing education required for license renewal, Respondent shall complete three (3) hours of continuing education in the area of surgical techniques and three (3) hours of continuing education in the area of Record Keeping within six months of the date the Board approves this Order. Respondent shall submit documentation of the completed continuing education penalty and the required annual continuing education to the Board within six months of the date the Board approves this Order. Documentation shall be submitted directly to the Texas Board of Veterinary Medical Examiners at 333 Guadalupe Street, Suite 3-810, Austin, Texas 78701.

3. ADHERENCE TO THE LAW AND BOARD RULES

- a. Respondent shall abide by the Board's Rules of Professional Conduct, the Texas Veterinary Licensing Act, and the laws of the State of Texas and the United States.
- b. Respondent shall cooperate with the Board's attorneys, investigators, compliance officers and other employees and agents investigating Respondent's compliance with this Order.
- c. Failure by Respondent to comply with the terms of this Order, or with any other provisions of the Veterinary Licensing Act or the Board Rules, may result in further disciplinary action.

The effective date of the terms of this Order shall be the date it is adopted by the Board, unless stated otherwise.



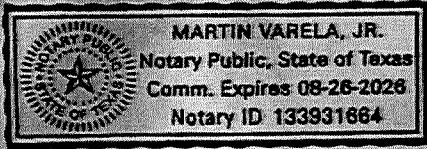
